

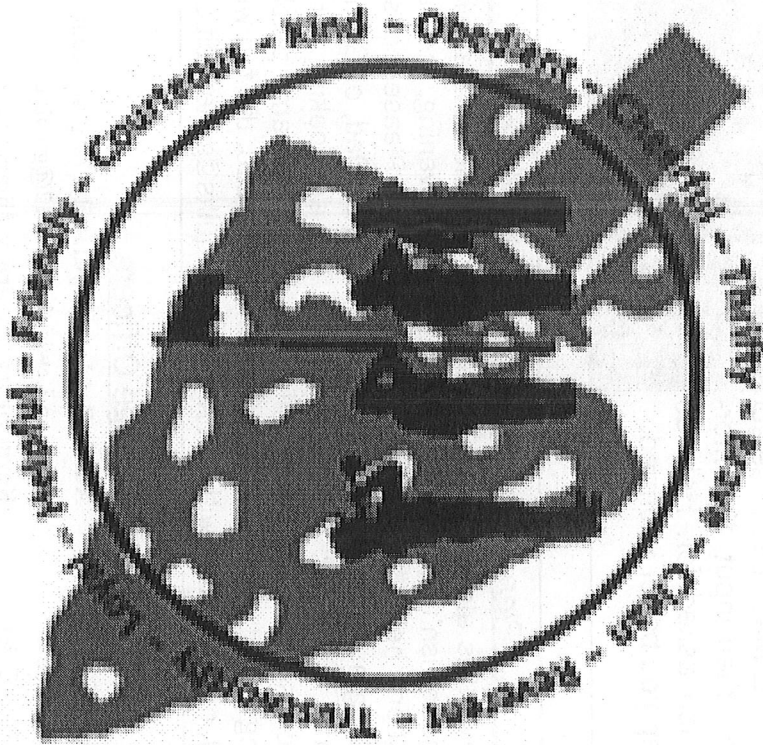

FROM THE CHIEF

Dear Lodge Brothers

I would like to thank everyone who attended the fellowship weekend, September 5- 7 2008, at Camp Dittmer. We arrived Friday and expected rain that night from hurricane Hanna. When everyone was checking in, we asked for help taking down tents immediately. We were able to get all the tents down and folded from the Upper Peninsula.

By 10:30 Saturday morning, all tents were down and inside the dining hall. They were folded and put away by lunch. After lunch, the ground outside of the new shower house was leveled. We also had a crew working on the docks, headed up by Mr. Crassi. I was told that it took less time getting them out of the water and stored away than last year, which is awesome. Great work!

We then went to work at the scout craft area and in the barn. The scout craft program area was expanded. The crew in the barn constructed 37 cots from parts, and there are still more parts. Joe Nuebecker built 20 cots working at Camp Dittmer while Finger Lakes Council was in residence. We still have parts for roughly 40 more cots.

Twenty new ordeal members came through this weekend and six members went through the Brotherhood conversion. There were 43 members present, for a total of 63 brothers attending. I want to thank everyone who attended. Without your help, I don't know what we would have done.

I also would like to thank Tim Brounschiedel, Don Starkey, John Luby, Paul Lewis, John Shrenker, Ron Schmidt, Paul Crawford, and Nate Demare for all of their help in the kitchen this past weekend. Without you guys, we wouldn't have had the awesome food that we had. The food was delightful. If you're free this summer, feel free to apply as the cooks at camp!

Mr. McMullen attended the weekend and was impressed with the work that was accomplished. I want to thank Chas Streb for all of the work he has done as Ordeal Master during the past years. I also would like to wish him the best of luck in his Eagle Scout project, and hope to see him back when it is completed.

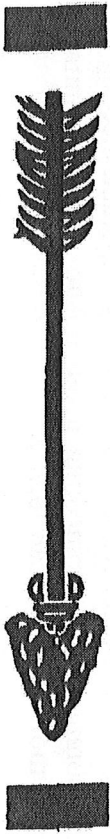

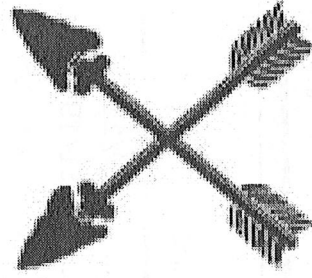
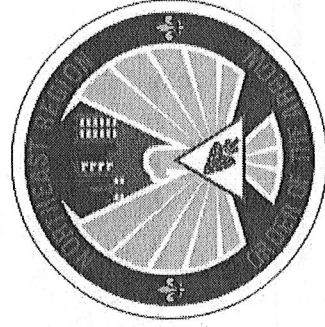

Medical care is readily available. Current personal health and medical summary (history) is attested by parents to be accurate. This form is filled out by all participants and is on file for easy reference.

Class 2 (required once every 36 months for all participants under 40 years of age). Activity: Resident camp or any other activity such as backpacking, tour camping, or recreational sports involving events lasting longer than 72 consecutive hours, with level of activity similar to that at home or school. Medical care is readily available.

Note: Some states require an annual precamp medical evaluation. Your BSA local council service center can advise you about the requirements for your state.

If your child has had a medical evaluation (physical examination) within the last 36 months, a copy of the results of this examination must be attached to the health history for all participants in a camping experience lasting longer than 72 consecutive hours. If a copy is not available, a physical examination (using the Class 2 section of this form) must be scheduled by a licensed health-care practitioner. This medical evaluation (physical examination) also is required if your child is currently under medical care, takes a prescribed medication, requires a medically prescribed diet, has had an injury or illness during the past 6 months that limited activity for a week or more, has ever lost consciousness during physical activity, or has suffered a concussion from a head injury.

*Examinations conducted by licensed health-care practitioners, other than physicians, will be recognized for BSA purposes in those states where such practitioners may perform physical examinations within their legally prescribed scope of practice.
