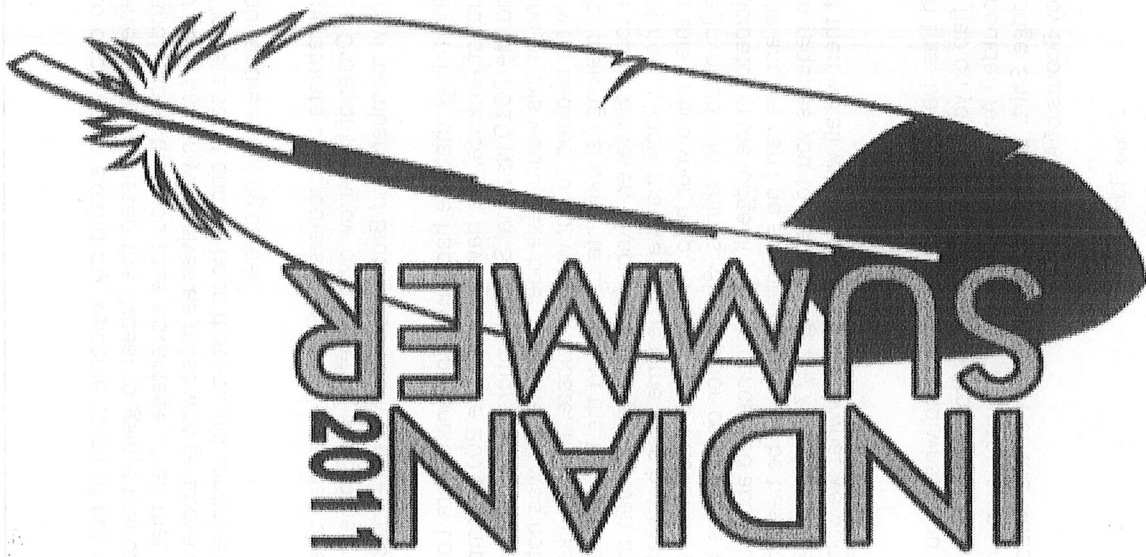

Dear Brothers,

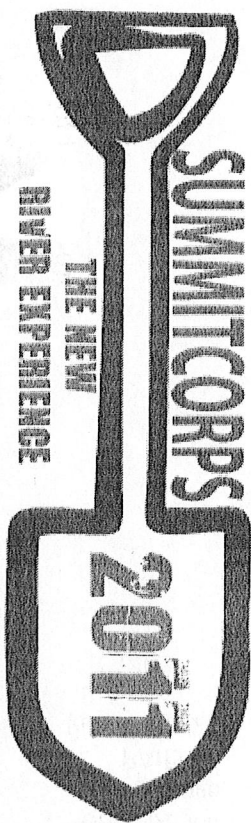

SummitCorps: The New River Experience is the newest service adventure offered by the Order of the Arrow. In conjunction with the National Parks Service, 500 Arrowmen from across the country will invade the New River Gorge National River in West Virginia.

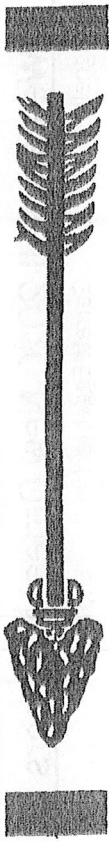
Arrowmen can choose which of four weeks to attend in July of 2011. Total, 2000 Arrowmen will give service to the New River by helping to build and restore the Garden Grand Hike and Bike Trail, which will connect the New River to the Summit: Bechtel Family Scout Reserve.

Lodges will be able to send contingents of up to 23 Arrowmen. Each week will consist of 425 guests and 100 staff. The cost for attending SummitCorps: The New River Experience is \$250, but in return Arrowmen can expect a different kind of adventure. An initial allotment of 8 guest spots has been provided to each lodge in the United States. Following December 1st slots will be opened to lodges on a first come first serve basis. Your council office will have received detailed information in mid September.

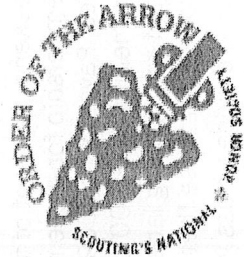
Words from the Lodge Adviser

Be Proud of Your Service

A few lucky people choose to perform "cheerful service" by working as an elangomat at our Lodge work weekends. I am one of them. I have been an adult elangomat ever since completing my Ordeal weekend for membership in the Order of the Arrow a few years ago.

When you take on this responsibility you meet some very interesting people, doctors, lawyers, businessmen and women, and the many "normal" folks. I always like to find out why an adult wants to belong to The Order. Many choose to join when a son or grandson are going through their ordeal. Some have other reasons: they want to be more involved in scouting; or, they are a Scoutmaster that wants to bond more with his scouts. However, the best reason I have ever heard was this past weekend.

During the 2010 Fall weekend at Camp Dittmer, I had an adult ordeal candidate who told me one of the best "reasons to be a candidate stories" I have heard. The candidate told me that several years ago, when he was 14 years old, he really wanted to be a member of the Order of the Arrow, but when he became eligible he was not voted in. He was not elected to a lodge the rest of his years as a youth member of BSA. The candidate told me that he had waited 55 years for this honor, and at 69 years of age he was chosen.

This 69 year old candidate went through the same Ordeal as every other candidate, took his vow of silence, did his cheerful service, ate what he was given, made the walks and slept under the stars with only a tarp and sleeping bag. I might add that he chose to sleep under the stars on the second night as well.

After his sash was placed on him at the ordeal ceremony, I asked this new adult member of our lodge, "Was it worth the wait?" His reply was "Yes, so far so good." So, the next time you wonder if it was worth it for you to complete the Ordeal, commit to Brotherhood membership, perform cheerful service, attend the LEC meetings and so many other events, I hope you will recall this adult candidate. Be glad that you didn't wait 55 years after being eligible to earn the patch on the flap of your uniform pocket and the sash like he did. Take pride in having been elected to this honor society and give back whenever you can by staying active in Scouting and attending lodge functions.

Nominations for the election of Lodge Officers are now open

At the annual Lodge Banquet to be held January 8, at the Batavia Party House, we will again be electing new officers for the Lodge Executive Committee. 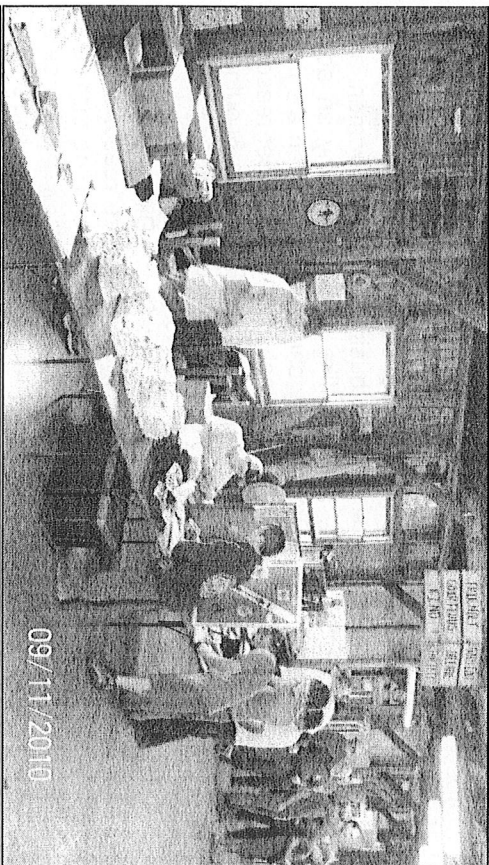
Unit Election Teams Needed

Calling all Lodge Members:

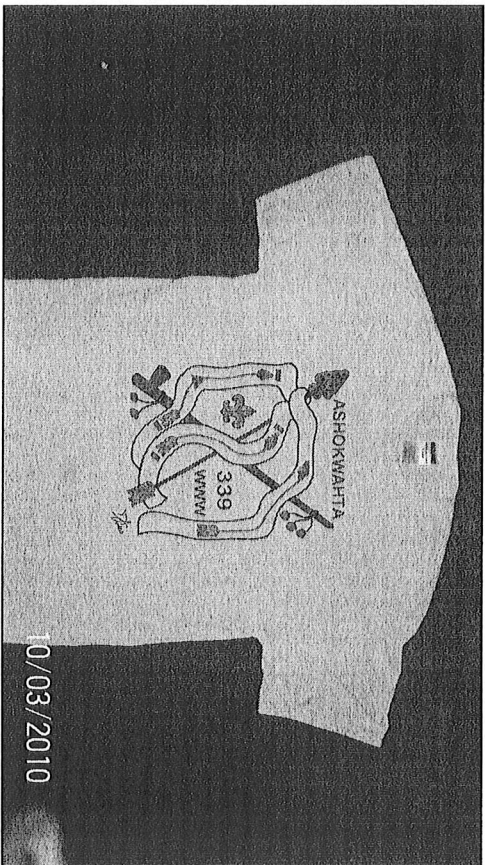

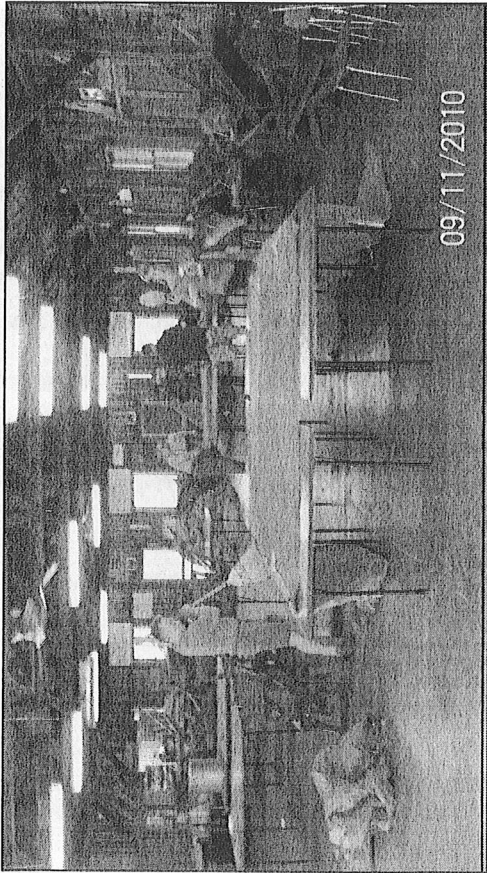


Registration and Lodge Trading Post at the Fall Weekend held at Camp Dittmer.

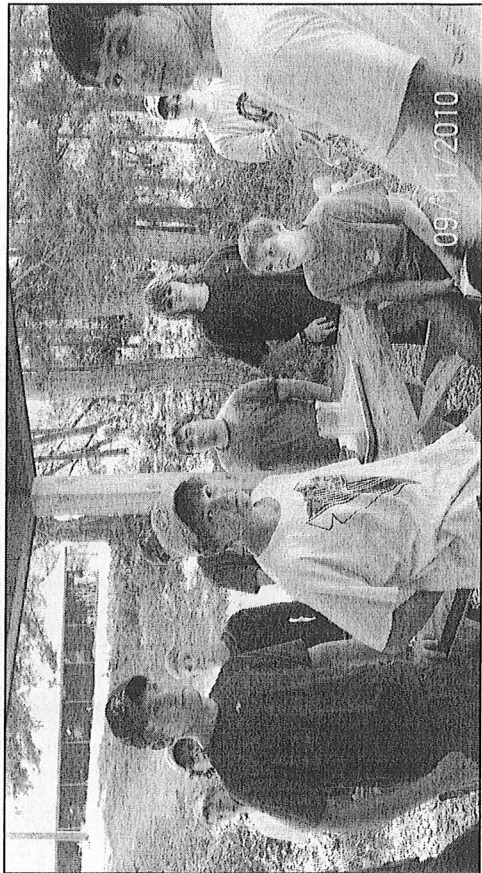

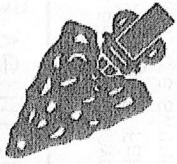
Fall Fellowship/Ordeal Weekend Camp Dittmer

Fellow Brothers,

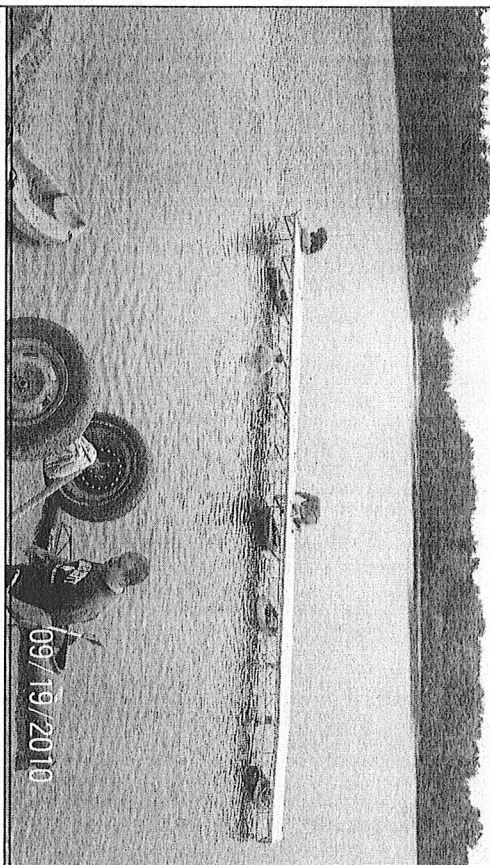

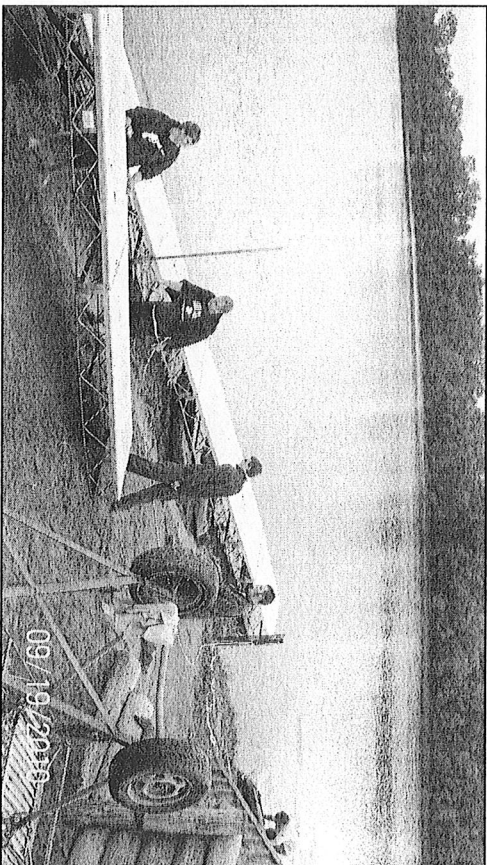
